	 Address issues resulting from experiences of domestic abuse.
	 Empower children and young people to aspire to a positive future.
	 Contribute to the prevention of future abuse by promoting health attitudes to relationships.
	Duties may include:
	 Supporting families and children in refuge, providing fun and stimulating activities to promote increased social and emotional wellbeing as well as enhancing the mother, child relationship.
	 Researching activities in the local community.
	 Co-facilitating Children and Young People's groups and supporting with school interventions.
	 Providing families with new opportunities.
	Support integrating families into the local community.
	Work will normally be based at a refuge and may consist of
	working individually or in conjunction with others.
Personal Profile	This role requires someone who has experience of supporting children, is patient, tolerant and enjoys working with children. The ideal person should be creative and imaginative and have good listening, speaking, explaining and writing skills, as well as being enthusiastic.
Specific Qualifications Required	Level 3 CYP qualification is desirable but not essential
Location	North Tyneside, Northumberland, County Durham, Darlington Stockton, Hartlepool and Redcar.
Commitment	We ask for volunteers to commit to a minimum of 4 hours per week. We would hope that you would be able to commit to volunteering for us for a minimum of 6 months.
